School's Strengths:

INST_ILP02: Instruction & Learning Paths

Testing has always been a strength with TNVA. Because of the logistics and mass populations across the state, it is a major undertaking and to get over 95% participation is even more difficult.

TNVA provides all the necessary items to be a successful student in the virtual setting. Providing computers, printers, curriculum, and internet for those who qualify is great to show that they provide everything for the student.

SO_ATT01: Attendance

TNVA implemented a new plan this year to better track attendance and push more accountability upon the student. Instead of being able to watch a recording to get attendance credit, the student has to attend classes and the teacher marks the attendance then. This is kept in the district SIS system that the teacher adds and has access to.

School's Notable Areas for Improvement:

SO_ENRL01: Enrollment

At the beginning of this school year and previous years, students will leave TNVA and not return. A procedure to track these students needs to be documented so that these students do not turn into a dropout count for the district or the school. This year it has gotten better but there were still many students at the beginning of the year.

SO_ENRL02: Enrollment

During this school year, in county residents that tried to apply to TNVA were denied enrollment because of missing paperwork. Some of the enrollments were tracked to the other virtual school in the state that is run by the same company. If a student enrolls from Union County or parent district, the enrollment should be almost automatic if a current Union County student.

INST_IPP01: Instructional Practices & Procedures

TNVA tested grades 3-5 did not improve from the year before and actually declined in some areas. The state has identified TNVA as an ATSI school in which the school just passed last year.

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Appendix: Definitions of Terms

Enrollment Types	Explanation
In-district Enrollment	Enrollment option for students who reside within the zone of residency of the school district that established the virtual school.
Out-of-district Enrollment	Enrollment option for students who reside within a contiguous county, municipality, or city outside the zone of residency of the school district establishing the virtual school.
State-wide Enrollment	Enrollment option for students who reside within Tennessee and outside the zone of residency of the school district that established the virtual school.

Instructional Model	Explanation
Asynchronous Virtual Instruction	An instructional model that provides students access to on-demand instruction that is fully virtual/online. This model allows students to access instructional materials and progress at their own pace and does not require students to attend regularly scheduled (daily/every other day) virtual classes with a teacher.
Bisynchronous Virtual Instruction	An instructional model that utilizes both asynchronous and synchronous virtual instruction.
Hybrid Virtual Instruction	An instructional model that provides students access to virtual instruction and requires students to periodically attend class in-person within a brick-and-mortar location.
Synchronous Virtual Instruction	An instructional model that provides scheduled, teacher supervised instruction that is fully virtual/online. This model of instruction does require students to attend regularly scheduled (daily/every other day) virtual classes with a teacher.
